

CANOPY FOR CLIMATE TREE GIVEAWAY PROGRAM



Laurus nobilis : **Bay Laurel**



Size:	On average, this tree is typically 20-40 feet tall with a spread of 15-30 feet wide.
Bloom Time:	This tree is evergreen. The flowers appear in spring, typically from March to May. In the fall, female trees produce small berries.
Appearance:	This tree is highly aromatic, producing the popular culinary herb bay leaf. The small, fragrant flowers can be green, white, or yellow.
Preferred Yard Size:	Ideal for small yards, because it is slow growing and can easily be pruned to control its size.
Watering:	Drought-tolerant once established.

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Lagerstroemia 'Biloxi' : Biloxi Crape Myrtle



Size:	On average, this tree is typically 15-25 feet tall with a spread of 15-25 feet wide.
Bloom Time:	This deciduous tree blooms in spring or summer. Pruning should be completed in winter or early spring, as this tree blooms on new wood.
Appearance:	Its branching habit is upright, vase-shaped to arching, with exfoliating bark. It's known for its bright pinkish-lavender ruffled blooms and vibrant orange-red fall foliage.
Preferred Yard Size:	Ideal for a small to medium yard, with access to full sun.
Watering:	Highly drought-tolerant once established. However, it benefits from occasional deep watering, especially in hot and dry conditions.

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Heteromeles arbutifolia : **California Holly/ Toyon**



Size:	On average, this tree is typically 10–25 feet tall with a spread of 8–15 feet wide.
Bloom Time:	This is an evergreen tree. This tree blooms clusters of small white flowers from spring to early summer. The tree will produce bright red berries that ripen in fall and winter.
Appearance:	Dark green, leathery leaves with serrated edges. The foliage is typically dense and forms a rounded or spreading canopy. The bark is reddish-brown and smooth when young, becoming rougher with age.
Preferred Yard Size:	Ideal for small yards.
Watering:	Highly drought-tolerant once established. However, they may benefit from occasional deep watering during extended periods of drought, especially when young or during hot, dry weather.

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Jacaranda mimosifolia : **Jacaranda**



Size:	On average, this tree is typically 25-50 feet tall with a spread of 15-30 feet wide.
Bloom Time:	This tree is deciduous. During late spring to early summer, the leaves will drop and be replaced by flowers.
Appearance:	Fern-like foliage and striking purple clusters of flowers. This creates a delicate, lacy appearance year-round.
Preferred Yard Size:	Ideal for medium yards. This tree sheds a large volume of leaves and flowers, so clean-up should be considered.
Watering:	Relatively drought-tolerant once established. However, they benefit from regular watering (especially during dry periods) to encourage healthy growth and flowering.



Quercus rugosa : **Netleaf Oak**



Size:	On average, this tree is typically 30-60 feet tall with a spread of 20-40 feet wide.
Bloom Time:	This evergreen tree flowers in spring.
Appearance:	Rounded canopy with lobed, dark green leaves and rough, dark gray bark. New leaves can be a bright red color before fading to green. The inconspicuous flowers are yellow.
Preferred Yard Size:	Ideal for large yards.
Watering:	Drought-tolerant once established, it is known for its resilience.

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Pistacia chinensis : **Chinese Pistache**



Size:	On average, this tree is typically 35-40 feet tall with a spread of 25-35 feet wide.
Bloom Time:	This deciduous tree blooms in spring.
Appearance:	This tree has a dark brown trunk and upright branching habit, providing ample shade. The inconspicuous red flowers are followed by large clusters of small, bright red berries. In cold autumn weather, the foliage turns vibrant shades of red, orange, and yellow.
Preferred Yard Size:	Ideal for medium yards.
Watering:	Drought-tolerant once established, this tree is known for its resilience.



Chitalpa tashkentensis 'Pink Dawn' : **'Pink Dawn' Chitalpa**



Size:	On average, this tree is typically 15-30 feet tall with a spread of 15-25 feet wide.
Bloom Time:	This partly deciduous tree can bloom in the fall, spring, or summer.
Appearance:	This tree, bred to be a garden accent, is usually multi-trunked and low-branching. The ruffled, light pink flowers have beautiful stripes and a yellow tint on the inside. The grayish-white bark creates an interesting silhouette in winter with its bare branches.
Preferred Yard Size:	Ideal for small yards. This slow-growing tree blooms best in full sun, and tends to grow taller in partial shade.
Watering:	Drought-tolerant once established. This tree thrives in hot, dry climates but requires deep, infrequent watering to maintain its showy flowers.
